Monday, March 10, 2014

The Monday, March 3, 2014, NCDOT Public Hearing and the Hyde County Board of Commissioners Meeting and CDBG FY2014 Public Hearing were postponed due to ice on county roadways; and, rescheduled for Monday, March 10, 2014, beginning at 5:00pm.

Public Hearing – Bridge #79:

Sterling Baker, NCDOT Division Maintenance Engineer and John Abel, NCDOT Division Bridge Program Manager presented the proposed removal of Bridge #79 (Roper Lane) in Engelhard and replacement with a Pedestrian Bridge. Mr. Baker explained the current Federal Bridge Replacement Program and related funding restrictions. Mr. Baker began Public Hearing at 5:00pm to receive citizen's comments and questions about the removal of Bridge #79.

The following members were present on the mainland: Commissioners Earl Pugh, Jr., Dick Tunnell, Benjamin Simmons, III and Barry Swindell; Attorney Fred Holscher; County Manager Bill Rich; Clerk to the Board Lois Stotesberry; and, members of the public.

The following members were present on Ocracoke: Public Information Officer Sarah Johnson and members of the public.

Commissioner John Fletcher was not present.

Bob Hayes, Owner, Engelhard Hotel – needs the bridge for truck access and recommends a cement tile be used to construct a new bridge.

Kit Gibbs, 101 Roper Lane, Engelhard – is concerned about emergency vehicle access and standing water on the shoulders of the road.

Barbara Jean Gibbs, Engelhard – asked what drivers are to do when Golden Street is under water.

Jerry, Hardison, Engelhard – asked whether or not the bridge could be built without driving pylons.

Commissioner Simmons asked if the bridge could only be replaced from the water up.

Hearing no further comments from the public, Mr. Baker closed Public Hearing on Removal of Bridge #79 in Engelhard and replacement with a Pedestrian Bridge at 5:40pm.

Commissioners Meeting:

Following NCDOT Public Hearing at 5:00pm, Chairman Barry Swindell called the Regular Meeting of the Hyde County Board of Commissioners to order at 6:00pm on Monday, March 10, 2014, in the Hyde County Government Center, Multi-Use Room, and the Ocracoke School Commons Room using electronic conferencing equipment.

Following opening prayer and music video by Bishop Levi Murray and pledge of allegiance, the meeting was called to order.

Welcome Commissioner Benjamin (Ben) Simmons, III:

Chairman Swindell introduced newly appointed Commissioner Ben Simmons. Mr. Simmons will complete the term of Commissioner Anson Byrd, through December 1, 2014. Mr. Simmons filed notice of candidacy for election to represent District 2 – Fairfield Township on February 28, 2014. This term ends December 2016.

Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Consideration of Minutes:

Commissioner Pugh moved to approve the February 3, 2014 Regular Meeting Minutes of the Hyde County Board of Commissioners as presented by the Clerk. Mr. Tunnell seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Resolution Supporting The Removal Of Bridge #79 (Roper Lane) In Engelhard And Replacing With A Pedestrian Bridge

At the Board of Commissioner's regularly scheduled meeting on February 3rd, Sterling Baker, PE, NCDOT, presented draft plans on how to handle Removal and Replacement of Bridge #79 in Engelhard. Mr. Baker reported the bridge is functionally obsolete and structurally deficient. Because construction of a new bridge would destroy Jessie Gibbs Service Station, a pedestrian bridge has been recommended. Mr. Baker requested Resolution of Support for installation of the pedestrian bridge.

Commissioner Tunnell moved to adopt "Resolution Supporting The Removal Of Bridge #79 (Roper Lane) In Engelhard And Replacing with a Pedestrian Bridge". Motion died for lack of a second.

Mr. Baker explained that if the Resolution was not adopted by the Board of Commissioners, the bridge funds would go back into the general fund and when the bridge no longer passed inspection it would be condemned and barricaded off.

Public Comments:

Chairman Swindell called for comments from the public.

Connie Lienbach, Ocracoke – reported the Ocracoke Civic & Business Association (OCBA) continues to request the National Park Service (NPS) provide lifeguard services on Ocracoke.

Leslie Lanier, Ocracoke – agrees with the need for lifeguards on Ocracoke beaches. She also complimented the Transformation Zone program presented by Bishop Levi Murray.

Lida Jones, Sarah Johnson and Fred Westervelt, Ocracoke – also agree with the need for lifeguards on Ocracoke beaches.

Commissioner Fletcher, Ocracoke – recommends calling our congressmen about the need for lifeguards on Ocracoke beaches.

Alice Mackey, President, Davis High Ventures, Inc. – asked the Board of Commissioners to renew Davis Ventures lease agreement with Hyde County.

There being no further comments from the public, Chairman Swindell continued the meeting.

Employee Recognition:

Manager Rich complimented Sarah Johnson, Public Information Officer (PIO), for keeping citizens informed and establishing good will between the Mainland and Ocracoke.

Justin Gibbs spun the Wheel of Thanks for Ms. Johnson and she won a Gift Certificate for Spoon River Restaurant in Belhaven.

NCACC Legislative Update Video:

Manager Rich reported that Todd McGee, Public Relations Director, North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) asked County Clerks and County Managers to play the Legislative Update video at its next meeting as a kickoff to NCACC preparations for the district meetings and the 2014 Legislative Short Session.

The Association continues its work on all goals adopted by the membership in 2013 with special emphasis on restoring funding for school constructions, second primaries, 911 funding, and jail standards. Update was given on Agriculture goals, Environmental goals, Health & Human Services goals, Intergovernmental Relations goals, Justice & Public Safety goals, Public Education goals and Tax & Finance goals.

Affordable Care Act Information:

Kris Noble, Planner/Developer, through communication with Tami Thompson, Outreach Coordinator, NC Agromedicine Institute, ECU, reported that the uninsured rate for farmers is ~30%, for loggers ~50%, for fishermen ~80-90%. This coupled with the fact that these individuals work in the most dangerous occupations in our state is a very important reason for them to have health insurance.

The North Carolina Agromedicine Institute recently received federal funding to provide education about the benefits of health coverage, new health insurance options and eligibility for tax credit and subsidy under the Affordable Care Act; and, to assist individuals with the enrollment process. Information about provisions for small businesses under the Affordable Care Act is also available although businesses wishing to enroll will need to do so with a local agent.

Hyde County will host an Affordable Care Act information and enrollment session in conjunction with the North Carolina Agromedicine Institute on Tuesday, March 25, 2014 in the Government Center, 30 Oyster Creek, Swan Quarter, N.C. from 8:30 to 5:00.

Farmers, loggers, and other individuals needing help with enrollment or wishing to learn more about whether or not they qualify for tax credits or subsidies to assist with the cost of health insurance under the Affordable Care Act are encouraged to attend. Pre-registration is required. The last day for regular enrollment for health insurance under the Affordable Care Act for 2014 is March 31, 2014.

Items of Consideration:

Public Hearing – CDBG FY13

Commissioner Pugh moved to open Public Hearing relative to the intention of Hyde County to apply for FY2013 CDBG funding under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act and to receive citizen's comments and questions. Mr. Fletcher seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Kris Noble, Planner/Developer, reported that the purpose of this hearing is to obtain the views and proposals of the citizens of Hyde County with regard to the determination of priorities for the community development needs of the county. Hyde County has need for and intends to construct a replacement wastewater treatment plant project to upgrade the Engelhard Sewer District Wastewater Treatment Plant. Public meeting is scheduled for March 25, 2014 beginning at 6:00pm at the Engelhard Volunteer Fire Department.

Hearing no comment from citizens, Chairman Swindell continued the meeting.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to close Public Hearing on FY2013 CDBG funding application. Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Commissioner Tunnell moved to approve FY2013 CDBG Funding Application and to adopt "Attachment 2 – Resolution By Governing Body of Applicant". Mr. Fletcher seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Appointment – BHM Regional Library Board

Manager Rich reported Susan Benning, Director, BHM Regional Library, has requested (letter dated January 16, 2014) re-appointment of Gwen Mullen to represent Hyde County on the BHM Regional Library Board. Ms. Mullen was first appointed in January 2008 with her term ending December 2013.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to appoint Gwen Mullen to serve on the BHM Regional Library Board. Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Appointment – Hyde Recreation Committee

Averi Simmons, Assistant to Planner, reported that Commissioner Ben Simmons has served as a member of the Hyde County Recreation Committee since it was reformed in 2012. As he is now serving on the Hyde Board of Commissioners, a replacement needs to be named to serve on the Recreation Committee from Fairfield Township.

Commissioner Simmons moved to appoint Nick Russ to serve on the Hyde Recreation Committee. Mr. Tunnell seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Resolutions:

Resolution Of Support Of Filling Vacant North Carolina Cooperative Extension Positions

Commissioner Pugh reported that the Board of Commissioners fully supports NC Cooperative Extension Service and the work this organization does to make our communities better places to live and work. Mr. Pugh reported that agriculture provides an estimated financial impact from crops (82,680 acres in farms), livestock, and government payments of \$74,452,788 in Hyde County.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to adopt "Resolution Of Support Of Filling Vacant North Carolina Cooperative Extension Positions". Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the

following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Resolution To Support The Restoration Of The Small County Supplemental Allotment

Dr. Randolph Latimore, Superintendent, Hyde County Schools, presented Resolution To Support The Restoration Of The Small County Supplemental Allotment. Dr. Latimore reported the Small County Supplemental Allotment was established by the General Assembly in 1991 and became effective in the 1992 fiscal year. Changes were made to the Allotment funding formula in the 2013-2014 state budget resulting in an overall reduction of funds in the Allocation distributed to all eligible county LEAs from previous levels. The Hyde County Public School System reduction resulted in financial losses of \$50,722 for the 2013-14 school year, \$332,532 for the 2014-15 school year, \$332,532 for the 2015-16 school year and \$211,421 for the 2016-17 school year for total financial loss to the Hyde County Public School System of \$927,207.

Commissioner Tunnell moved to adopt "Resolution To Support The Restoration Of The Small County Supplemental Allotment". Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Memorandum of Understanding Between NCACC, ICMA And Hyde County

Manager Rich presented a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC), International City/County Management Association (ICMA) and Hyde County for the NCACC County Management Fellowship Program, to take effect on July 1, 2014. A goal of the NCACC and ICMA through this program is to attract recent Master of Public Administration/Affairs/Policy (MPA/MPP) graduates to careers in North Carolina county government management and administration. The NCACC will provide a \$25,000 grant to Hyde County Government to help with Hyde County Governments costs of the Fellowship Program for the 2014-15 fiscal year. The County will pay \$10,000 for a total of \$35,000.

Commissioner Pugh moved to approve "Memorandum of Understanding Between NCACC, ICMA and Hyde County". Mr. Tunnell seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Resolution In Support of Regulation of Smoking and Use of Vapor Products In County Buildings, on County Grounds (within 25 linear feet of county buildings) and In County Vehicles

Lisa Phillips, Health Education Specialist, Alcohol & Tobacco Prevention Task Force, presented "Resolution In Support of Regulation of Smoking and Use of Vapor Products In County Buildings, on County Grounds (within 25 linear feet of county buildings) and In County Vehicles". It shall be unlawful: 1) for any person to smoke or use vapor products in any building or facility or portion of a building or facility now or hereafter owned, leased, operated, occupied, managed, or controlled by the County of Hyde; 2) for any person to smoke or use vapor products in any vehicle now or hereafter owned or leased by the county; and, for any person to smoke or use vapor products within 25 linear feet from all buildings owned or leased by the county.

Commissioner Swindell moved to approve "Resolution In Support of Regulation of Smoking and Use of Vapor Products In County Buildings, on County Grounds (within 25 linear feet of county buildings) and In County Vehicles". Mr. Tunnell seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – Fletcher; Absent or not voting – None.

Resolution In Support Of National Park Service To Extend Lifeguard Services On Ocracoke

Manager Rich reported the National Park Service provides lifeguard services from 9:00am to 5:00pm from Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day. The lifeguard area is approximately one-half mile from the edge of Ocracoke Village along Highway 12 at the first paved parking lot on the right heading north. Mr. Rich reported a tourism based economy has been developed on Ocracoke Island where access to the beaches has always been the foundation of the village's economic base upon which local families depend for their livelihood. Ocracoke Island beaches are the defining element of visitor's complete seashore experience. He believes that a reduction in lifeguard services on Ocracoke will have a devastating impact on North Carolina residents, tourists, local businesses, restaurants and lodging and stated that the Hyde County Board of Commissioners strongly supports National Park Services extending lifeguard services on Ocracoke.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to adopt Resolution In Support Of National Park Service To Extend Lifeguard Services On Ocracoke. Mr. Tunnell seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None

Procurement of Professional Services - HMGP

Kris Noble, Planner/Developer, reported that Hyde County has received Grant Agreement from NC Division of Emergency Management for the elevation of five (5) homes that suffered flood damage during Hurricane Irene in 2011. A request for proposals was published in the Washington Daily News for professional consulting services for asbestos inspection, surveying, and engineering. Proposals were received from: Asbestos Inspections – W.F. Bulow and Keenan Consulting; Surveying – Hood Richardson, Spruill & Associates, Sorrell Land Surveying and Mayo & Associates; and, Engineering - Weston Lyall, Appian Engineering and James Rivera. Based on scoring by HCP, Inc., it was recommended that contracts be awarded to W.F. Bulow for asbestos inspections, Sorrell Land Surveying, and Appian Engineering.

Commissioner Pugh moved to approve award of professional services, and authorize county staff to enter into contracts with W.F. Bulow, Sorrell Land Surveying, and Appian Engineering. Mr. Fletcher seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

FY2012-2013 Hyde County Audit Presentation

Andrew Harris, CPA, presented the FY2012-2013 Hyde County Audit. Mr. Harris reported ending governmental fund balance of \$7,964,290 representing a net change in fund balance of \$721,103; and, tax levy collection at 93.99%.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to accept report of the FY2012-2013 Hyde County Audit as presented by Andrew Harris, CPA. Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

ABC Board Financial Report

Meredith Nicholson, Chairman, Hyde County ABC Board, presented Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss reports as of January 31, 2014.

No action required.

Davis High Ventures, Inc. Lease Renewal

Manager Rich reported that Davis High Ventures, Inc. currently occupies a portion of the Davis School building in Engelhard. The lease between the County of Hyde and Davis Ventures is currently expired. The proposed new lease term will be from March 3, 2014 through March 3, 2019.

Commissioner Pugh moved to renew Davis High Ventures, Inc. Lease Agreement with Hyde County for a five (5) year term from March 3, 2014 through March 3, 2019. Mr. Fletcher seconded the

motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Hyde County Community Development Corporation (CDC) – Lease Agreement

Manager Rich reported that Hyde County Community Development Corporation (CDC) has leased a portion of the former Davis School building in Engelhard from Hyde County since 2003 and has operated the Hyde Davis Business Enterprise Center (HDBEC) at the Davis building since 2003. He reported that in a letter dated February 21, 2014 from the CDC, Hyde County was formally notified that the CDC will not seek renewal of this lease. The CDC thanks Hyde County for their support over its twenty year existence.

Tenants who sub-lease office space may contact Kris Noble, Planner/Developer, for lease renewal assistance.

Dates for the 2014 Board of Equalization and Review

Linda Basnight, Tax Administrator, reported that each year the Board of Equalization and Review (E&R) shall hold its first meeting not earlier than the first Monday in April and not later than the first Monday in May. In non-revaluation years the Board of Equalization and Review shall complete its duties on or before the third Monday following its first meeting. There must be at least three (3) Board members present for the meeting.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to hold the first 2014 Hyde County Board of Equalization and Review meeting on Monday, April 7, 2014, beginning at 4:00pm and ending at 6:00pm, and its last Board of Equalization and Review meeting on Monday, April 21, 2014 beginning at 6:00pm. Mr. Pugh seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Graceful Bakery Revolving Loan Application

Kris Noble, Planner/Developer, reported that Graceful Bakery has applied to borrow \$15,000.00 from the Hyde County Revolving Loan Fund. The business will be an Ocracoke-based business that plans to take over the Corner Crepe, an existing food trailer located at 110 Back Road, Ocracoke, NC. Graceful Bakery will offer Ocracoke Island's residents and visitors fresh, wholesome artisan breads, sweet and savory crepes, cookies, and other value-added prepared food for breakfast and lunch, using the finest ingredients and extremely friendly service. Graceful Bakery will employ one (1) full-time low to moderate income person residing in Ocracoke.

The Hyde County Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) Committee met on Monday, February 3, 2014 at 10 a.m. in the Government Center, Swan Quarter to review the full application and recommends the Board of Commissioners approve the loan.

Commissioner Fletcher moved to approve a \$15,000.00 Revolving Loan Funds (RLF) loan to Graceful Bakery. Mr. Tunnell seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Tunnell, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – None; Absent or not voting – None.

Timeline For DSS Move To ECB Building

Manager Rich reported the Department of Social Services (DSS) has tentatively set July 1, 2014 as the moving date for DSS to the ECB Building in Engelhard. At it's regularly scheduled meeting on February 3rd it was decided that more research and discussion about this matter was needed to allow for public input.

Commissioner Pugh reported 40% of the DSS clients served live in Engelhard.

Commissioner Tunnell expressed concern that traveling to Engelhard would create hardship for citizens who live in the western part of the County.

Commissioner Pugh moved to proceed to move DSS to the ECB Building in Engelhard on July 1, 2014. Mr. Fletcher seconded the motion. The motion passed on the following vote: Ayes – Fletcher, Pugh, Simmons and Swindell; Nays – Tunnell; Absent or not voting – None.

Beach Tolls – Daily Passes

Commissioner Fletcher presented recommendations for beach tolling and daily beach passes. Mr. Fletcher believes the National Park Service’s (NPS) rules and regulations negatively impact use of Hyde County beaches. He will present Resolution to set day and/or weekend passes and fees at the next regularly scheduled Hyde County Board of Commissioners meeting on April 7, 2014.

West/Quarter/Double & Bay Steering Committee

The Hyde Soil & Water Conservation District (in a memo dated March 7, 2014) reported the Hyde County Board of Commissioners at their November 4, 2013 meeting rescinded their action taken at the previous board meeting in October to raise the West/Quarter/Double & Bay tax assessment to \$0.35 per \$100. The Board of Commissioners requested that the Swan Quarter Steering Committee meet again and review the current assessment rate and maintenance issues concerning tidegate repair/replacement and set a rate that is consistent with Board of Commissioners resolution action taken on August 3, 1987 to set the rate at a per acre value through a division of land separating it into Class I, II, and III in relation to the proximity to the dike.

Citizens are encouraged to attend a meeting scheduled for Friday, March 14, 2014 at 8:30a.m. in the Hyde Government Center Teaching Kitchen to discuss these issues. Recommendation will be made to the Board of Commissioners on an assessment rate for the West/Quarter/Double & Bay at the next regularly scheduled Board of Commissioners meeting on April 7, 2014.



WHEREAS the North Carolina General Assembly provides funding to provide additional support for small county school systems in the State of North Carolina ("LEAs"), and

WHEREAS this funding allocation is more commonly referred to as the Small County Supplemental Allotment ("the Allotment"), and

WHEREAS the Allotment was established by the General Assembly in 1991 and became effective in the 1992 fiscal year, and

WHEREAS county LEAs with fewer than 3,239 students are eligible for appropriations from the Allotment, and

WHEREAS the Allotment is based on a funding formula ("Allotment funding formula") created by the General Assembly and takes into consideration the divergent economic factors within each county, and

WHEREAS significant changes were made to the Allotment funding formula in the 2013-2014 state budget, and

WHEREAS the changes made to the Allotment funding formula in the 2013-2014 state budget result in an overall reduction of funds in the Allocation distributed to all eligible county LEAs from previous levels, and


WHEREAS the changes resulted in a financial loss of \$50,722 to the Hyde County Public School System for the 2013-2014 school year, and


WHEREAS the changes will result in a financial loss of \$332,532 to the Hyde County Public School System for the 2014-2015 school year, a loss of \$332,532 for the 2015-2016 school year, and an loss of \$211,421 for 2016-2017 school year, for total financial loss to the Hyde County Public School System of \$927,207, and

WHEREAS Hyde County Public Schools depend on the Small County Supplemental Allotment to provide for teacher pay, textbooks and others vital instructional support materials, and

WHEREAS the changes made to the Allotment funding formula in the 2013-2014 state budget will have dramatic effects on Hyde County public education and school systems throughout rural North Carolina.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hyde County Board of Commissioners hereby support restoration by the General Assembly of overall funding for the Small County Supplemental Allotment to the 2012-2013 level.

RESOLUTION

Regulation of smoking and use of vapor products in county buildings, on county grounds (within 25 linear feet of county buildings) and in county vehicles.

(1)

Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:

(1a) "Smoking" shall mean the inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying of lighted pipes, cigars, cigarettes, or other combustible tobacco products or any clove, herbal, or non tobacco product.

(1b) "Vapor product" shall mean any noncombustible product that employs a mechanical heating element, battery, or electronic circuit regardless of shape or size and that can be used to heat a liquid nicotine solution contained in a vapor cartridge. The term includes an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, and electronic pipe. The term does not include any product regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration under Chapter V of the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

(1c) "Grounds" shall mean the area located within 25 linear feet of a county building or facility or portion of a building or facility now or hereafter now owned, leased, or occupied by the County of Hyde.

(2)

Smoking and use of vapor products prohibited in county buildings. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke or use vapor products in any building or facility or portion of a building or facility now or hereafter owned, leased, operated, occupied, managed, or controlled by the County of Hyde.

(3)

Smoking and use of vapor products regulated in county vehicles. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke or use vapor products in any vehicle now or hereafter owned or leased by the county.

(4)

Smoking and use of vapor products prohibited on county grounds within a minimum of 25 linear feet from county owned or leased buildings. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke or use vapor products within 25 linear feet from all buildings owned or leased by the county.

(5)

Penalty. Violation of this section shall constitute an infraction punishable by a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

(6)

Abrogation. This ordinance is not intended to repeal, abrogate, or impair any greater restriction imposed by any other state law or local government ordinance. Wherever the provisions of any other law, ordinance, regulation, or restriction impose higher standards than are required by the provisions of this ordinance, this ordinance does not prohibit enforcement of any such law, ordinance, regulation or restriction.
