## Partnership For The Sounds

The **Partnership for the Sounds (PFS)** is a private, non-profit organization whose mission is to promote sustainable, locally-based economic development on the Albemarle-Pamlico peninsula through environmental education and nature-based and cultural tourism. Since beginning operations in 1994, our primary activity has been building and running a network education/tourism centers that highlight regional ecosystems and promote visitation to local natural areas and other attractions. Below are brief descriptions of our facilities:

### *North Carolina Estuarium*

Located on the Pamlico River waterfront in Washington, the Estuarium focuses on North Carolina's vital estuaries, especially the Pamlico Sound and the Tar-Pamlico River (estuaries are bodies of water formed by the mixing of salt and fresh water). Exhibitory explores coastal and estuarine ecosystems, native fish and wildlife, why the estuary is important, how we can protect it, and ways the river and sound have influenced human history in this area.

### *Columbia Theater Cultural Resources Center*

In the mid-1990s PFS joined with local interests to rehabilitate the old Columbia Theater and convert it into the Columbia Theater Cultural Resource Center, a museum that looks at how people have utilized the environment of the Albemarle-Pamlico peninsula through farming, fishing, and forestry. The Theater also hosts local cultural events and even pays tribute to its origin by showing old westerns and other classic movies.

### *Roanoke/Cashie River Center*

Located on the Cashie River in Windsor, the RCRC interprets the natural and cultural history of the lower Roanoke River region, particularly the area's great



forests and their importance to migratory songbirds. It has a primary exhibit building and a secluded boardwalk along the river that lets visitors enjoy the serene Cashie waterfront.

### *Other Columbia Facilities*

PFS operates the Tyrrell County Visitor's Center (TCVC), which is located on the beautiful Scuppernong River in Columbia. Along with serving over 400,000 people per year and providing information about attractions throughout the region, the TCVC houses the Partnership's corporate offices.

Right next door to the TCVC is the Walter B. Jones Sr. Center for the Sounds. This facility serves as headquarters for the Pocosin Lakes National Wildlife Refuge, and also has an Exhibit Hall and Visitors Center which are administered and staffed by PFS.

### *Free River Tours*

All Partnership facilities provide boat tours along their local river from April-October, offering local residents and visitors alike the chance to enjoy a waterside view of the historic charm and natural

beauty so characteristic of our part of the world. The tours are free, but reservations are needed because they are very popular.

### *Hyde County Involvement*

PFS has a long history of involvement in Hyde County as well. One of our original missions was to work with other local organizations to help reopen Mattamuskeet Lodge, and from 1995 until the Lodge closed in 2000 we provided a staff person to facilitate Lodge use and implemented a variety of building improvements. From 2003-2011 we partnered with the Octagon House Restoration Inc., to help staff that historic site and fund critical repairs around the building. Through the years we have also given substantial administrative and financial assistance to projects like the Engelhard Seafood Festival and Swan Days. Currently we are working to increase our outreach to Hyde schools and provide other types of programming in the county. We look forward to seeing you on the road less traveled!

## Rules Now In Effect For Beach Driving

### Effective February 15, 2012

Cape Hatteras National Seashore is a popular recreation destination where visitors participate in a variety of recreational activities. Off-road vehicles (ORVs) are one way for visitors to enjoy the seashore's ocean beaches and sound-side waters. The seashore also contains important wildlife habitat created by dynamic environmental processes. Several species listed under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), including the piping plover, seabeach amaranth, and three species of sea turtles, are found within the park.

To comply with executive orders and a National Park Service (NPS) regulation regarding the use of ORVs on the public lands within the National Park System, the NPS has recently developed an ORV management plan and special regulation to preserve the unique plants and wildlife of this dynamic barrier island ecosystem while permitting the carefully managed use of vehicles on designated ORV routes at the seashore. The special regulation becomes effective on February 15, 2012.

The special regulation requires visitors to have an ORV special use permit to operate a vehicle on the designated ORV routes at the seashore. ORV permits can be obtained beginning February 15<sup>th</sup> at any of the three NPS permit offices located at Coquina Beach, the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse Visitor Center (Buxton), and the Ocracoke Visitor Center. These offices will be open year-round, seven days a week (except Christmas Day), from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., with expanded hours on weekends and holidays during the summer season. The cost of an annual ORV permit (valid for the calendar year) is \$120. The cost for a 7-day ORV permit (valid from the date issued) is \$50.


