

Coastal Culture and Waterfowl Watching Excursion

January 21-22, 2014

Thousands of snow geese and tundra swan are common sights in eastern North Carolina during the winter. Join the North Carolina Maritime Museum in Beaufort and the Core Sound Waterfowl Museum and Heritage Center for an overnight excursion to provide a close-up look at these seasonal visitors and many other species of waterfowl.

Staff from both museums will serve as field guides and travel hosts. Pointy pintails, bashful buffleheads, mergansers, and other feathered friends can be observed. The fun-filled action packed birding trip includes an overnight stay in Nags Head.
